ART FUNDAMENTALS

UNDERSTANDING COLOUR

This course provides a basic understanding of colour theory and how it can be put to practical use. Each week, students learn a vital component of colour theory through making swatches of colour combinations and then using this information to make a small painting. Students are encouraged to keep their studies and projects in a reference binder, to be used as an aid for future painting projects. Suitable for all levels.

ART HISTORY, THEORY

ART HISTORY: DADA TO POP 1915-1965

Using the Dada movement as a point of departure, this course follows Western visual art from the early to mid-20th century to the Pop Art of the 1960s. Students become familiarized with leading movements such as Surrealism, New Objectivity, Abstract Expressionism, Neo Dada and Pop. Discussions focus on the ideas, materials, and social and political contexts of artists who made up these movements. Class formats include image-based lectures, class discussion and readings. Suitable for all levels.

CONTEMPORARY ART I

This two-part course follows the trajectory of contemporary art from the mid-20th century to the present. Beginning with an overview of contemporary art and selected artists, we then move to the aftermath of Modernism, and late-twentieth century trends in painting, photography, sculpture and installation. Includes lectures, discussion, as well as hands-on art projects. Required Textbook: Tony Godfrey *The Story of Contemporary Art* The MIT Press (Nov 10 2020). Used for Contemporary Art I and II. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING

DRAWING FOR THE ABSOLUTE BEGINNER

Ideal for people with little or no experience in drawing! Students draw from direct observation with emphasis on the line quality, value, shading, negative space and perspective. Skills necessary to make a good drawing are developed through basic materials such as pencils and charcoal. By the end of twelve weeks you will have the confidence to sit down in front of any subject and start to draw. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: INTRODUCTION I

An introduction to the basic materials and techniques of drawing with emphasis line, shape, value, space, proportion, perspective and composition. In addition, students are encouraged to explore a range of materials and develop personal expression in their drawing. Subject matter includes still life, the figure, landscape, architectural space and student-supplied source material. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: BEYOND REALISM

As the definition of "real" itself becomes more vague in a world of unverified content and digitally-constructed realities, this course embraces this uncertainty and attempts to redefine what realist drawing can be. Examine precedent works of realism and learn techniques of representational drawing before experimenting with new methods of depicting reality. Through in-class exercises and term assignments, different ways of capturing reality by illustrating physical forms, movement, time, and narratives are explored. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: THEMATIC APPROACHES

Visit some of the current themes in contemporary drawing such as: mark making, mapping, science, nature, architecture, ornament, narrative and nostalgia. Focus is on a mixed media approach to imaginative explorations in image making. Basic drawing materials such as pencil, charcoal, ink and watercolours, as well as a range of drawing surfaces including new and found papers are used. *Previous drawing experience recommended*.

THE GRAPHIC NOVEL

Learn how to develop your ideas for a story into a graphic novel through storyboarding techniques. Different drawing materials and publishing options are used to create a hand drawn graphic novel. Weekly check-ins and group critiques will offer inspiration, support and guidance to take your idea to the page and draw down that story you have inside of you. We look at and discuss various graphic novels to learn from and for inspiration. Some drawing experience recommended.

MIXED MEDIA

COLLAGE: MATERIALS AND PROCESS

This course covers some of the major historical and contemporary trends in collage making, starting with Picasso and Braque to Surrealism, to today's use of digital applications. Also included: uses of colour; surface treatments using both dry and wet media; creating hand decorated collage papers; acrylic transfer skins; working with photographs; applying stencils and masks; working with found objects and ephemera and image transfer techniques. *Suitable for all levels*.

DIGITAL COLLAGE

Create digital collages with photographs and photographic imagery from start to finish. Themes such as the botanical, landscapes and surrealism are discussed. Through class discussions, learn how to pre-plan your compositions and gather source material, from both your own photographic images and copyright free material before starting with a blank Photoshop workspace. Techniques such as choosing selections, using layers and masks and retouching techniques will be discussed. Requirements: basic knowledge of digital photography and image handling (importing, organizing, etc.). Some experience with Adobe Photoshop is a plus. You will need a computer with Photoshop installed. Adobe Bridge, Lightroom, and a graphics tablet recommended, but not essential. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING INTO PAINTING: INK & WATERCOLOUR

Explore the wide range of possibilities that ink, watercolour and mixed media provide to create exciting artwork in drawing and painting. Each week is devoted to a different subject and approach. Subjects include portraits, figures, landscapes, flowers and still life objects. Working with ink and water involves the dance between control and spontaneity, draftsmanship and observation, creating a bridge between drawing and painting. Materials explored and explained include dip pens, brush pens, brushes, and twigs. Techniques will be demonstrated with reference to a different featured artist each week. *No drawing experience necessary.*

QUILTING AND EMBROIDERY: MAPPING AND MEMORY

Learn basic quilting, embroidery and cross stitch techniques with a focus on mapping and memory. Students will be given an opportunity to use digital applications to convert and manipulate their own images into stitching projects. Assignments challenge students to develop work along the themes of mapping and memory and to draw from influences of contemporary artwork shown in class. Learn and develop skills in two-dimensional artwork, sculpture and book making. Suitable for all levels.

PAINTING

PAINTING: INTRODUCTION I

Understand the basic elements of painting such as shape, space and composition as well as how to develop a full colour palette. Focus is also on the material qualities of paint including mixing and application to surfaces. Develop your own language and approach to painting as basic techniques are learnt. Classes include hands-on demonstrations, the use of still life, found imagery, live models and photographs. Students can work in acrylics or oils. Suitable for all levels.

PAINTING: THE CANADIAN LANDSCAPE I

Engage with the approaches of foundational Canadian painters who sought to interpret and represent the land. A selection of artists from across Canada up to the 1970s are presented, including Tom Thomsom, David Milne, Emily Carr, the Group of Seven, and others. Paint in a medium of your choice including watercolour, gouache, acrylic or oils. A great way to learn about Canadian art history while applying new ideas and techniques to your work. Some painting experience is recommended.

PAINTING: COLOUR AND COMPOSITION

Colour and composition are the two most important considerations in any painting. Develop an understanding of the colour wheel and working with colour schemes that emphasize value, temperature and discords. Focus is on creating colour harmony in a painting. The course will also include in-class exercises covering the elements that go into making a dynamic composition such as proportion, focal point and balance. *Suitable for all levels*.

PAINTING: THE LURE OF THE LOCAL

Inspired by writer and art critic Lucy Lippard's book of the same title, the focus is on understanding our relationship to place as a source for subject matter. Projects include ideas around memory, land use, cities and suburbs, perception of nature, how we produce the landscape and how the landscape affects our lives. Students work in a painting medium of their choice (acrylic, oil, watercolour or gouache). Some painting experienced required.

PAINTING: UNDERSTANDING ABSTRACTION I

Course begins by following the trajectory of abstract painting from its early beginnings in late 19th century to end of the 20th century. The second part of the course (offered in Winter) concentrates on contemporary artists who use abstraction as the main component of their painting. Learn about several artists each week, and develop a painting based on one of the artists shown. Includes weekly critiques, slide presentations on the history of abstraction and hands-on exercises to be done in class. Learn that abstraction is much more complex and interesting than you ever could imagine. Recommended Textbook: Moszynska, Anna Abstract Art Thames & Hudson, 2020 Edition. Suitable for all levels.

OCTOBER

October 14 MIXED MEDIA PORTRAITS

This workshop will involve working with black and white photographs as a base for a unique mixed media portrait. The photos will be prepared in advance by the instructor who will create a high contrast dot screened version on an overhead transparency. You will use collage, application of acrylic paints and coloured pencils as well as sanding and scraping to create an exciting finished portrait.

October 14 DRAWING PERSPECTIVE: ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW

Devised in the Italian Renaissance, linear perspective is a system of creating the illusion of depth in drawing and painting. Knowing and applying a few simple rules will help you to create convincing interior and exterior spaces. In this one-day workshop, learn to use one and two-point perspective to draw remembered rooms, invented spaces, and to work from life and from photographs.

Create your own unique landscape painting by learning about composition, colour mixing, paint application and how to create energy and light within your painting.

Are you curious about watercolour but aren't sure where to begin? DRAWING: SENSE OF PLACE

Capture the essence of place through drawing with graphite on mylar. Working from photographs taken on a walk in our urban setting, use drawing as a means of close observation. With graphite pencils and drawing techniques, discover the significance of spending time examining the overlooked and ignored details of our surroundings. Explore light and shadow, master the delicate art of texture, and cultivate a keen eye for detail. Learn technical drawing skills to translate photographs into sensitive monochromatic pieces.

November 4 FLOWER PATTERNS WITH GOUACHE

Gouache is an opaque water-based medium that creates a rich velvety surface when dry and has the unique ability to work extremely well on black watercolour paper. This workshop focuses on creating whimsical patterns with botanical elements such as flowers and leaves on a black surface, ranging from the simple to the complex. Ideal for those who have always wanted to try gouache paint but didn't know how to get started. The step-by-step and easy-to-follow instructions will help you fall in love with this medium in no time.

Focus will be on creating lush, textured mark-making, rich colour, and subtle effects only oil paint can achieve.

This workshop will focus on inventive ways to use found collage papers and shapes from magazines to create several abstract landscape collages. Approaches will rely on both spontaneous and deliberate ways of creating dynamic compositions. *Suitable for all levels*.

DECEMBER

December 2 MAPPING WITH THREAD

You will explore three fibre techniques while using the theme of mapping. These include basic hand sewing, using thread to create structure on dissolvable fabric, and using scissors to remove parts of a patterned fabric to make a new surface. You will learn these methods through the creation of samplers with contemporary fibre art maps as a source of inspiration.

Key concepts taught include: using a limited palette and colour mixing to create different moods or atmospheres.

This workshop focuses on 'Vanitas' was a form of still life painting style popular in the 17th Century and includes symbolism through the use of skulls, extinguished candles, musical instruments, books, flowers and fruit. Explore the hidden meaning within vanitas paintings and create your own vanitas painting using one of your personal possessions plus objects in the art room. Also, learn about three-dimensional drawing techniques, composition and how to use burnt umber to create depth, shadows and drama.

WATERCOLOUR: EXPERIMENTAL LANDSCAPES

The unique qualities of watercolour make it an ideal medium to create 'experimental landscapes'. Discussion of colour and composition will also be covered.
