Fall 2024 Courses

ART FUNDAMENTALS

UNDERSTANDING COLOUR

This course guides students through the complexities of colour theory with weekly exercises that focus on making colour swatches. The systematic assignments explore the full range of colour mixing and as well as colour combinations. Topics covered include value, complements, temperature, as well as how colours change depending on context. By the end of the 12-week course, students will gain a thorough understanding of the colour wheel and how colour theory can be put to immediate use in their paintings. The colour assignments culminate in a completed personal workbook that becomes a long-term source book. Students can work in acrylic, watercolour or gouache. Oil paint is possible but challenging due to the slow drying time. Suitable for all levels.

ART HISTORY, THEORY

ART HISTORY: THE HUMAN FORM

This art history course covers the use of the body in art from Ancient Egypt to mid-19th Century. From ancient to premodern times, sculptors and painters created works depicting royalty, deities, mythological figures, and common people. The first part of this course will explore the depiction of the human body in ancient Egypt, Greece, Rome, Africa, Japan, China, and South Asia. Additionally, the course will cover significant art movements in Western art up to the mid-19th century, focusing on human forms. This course will give students an overview of how various cultures dealt with the idea of human body in art as for some cultures it was a devotional act, whereas for other cultures, it was political. CONTEMPORARY ART I

Contemporary Art I follows the trajectory of contemporary art from the mid-20th century to the beginning of the 21st century. The course begins with an overview of contemporary art and selected artists and then moves to the aftermath of Modernism, and late-twentieth century trends in painting, photography, sculpture and installation. Social, political and other artistic genres (such as literature, music and film) are taken into consideration when discussing the art. Course includes lectures, discussion, as well as hands-on art projects. To obtain a good grasp of the subject matter, it is important to have the textbook. Required Textbook: Tony Godfrey The Story of Contemporary Art The MIT Press (Nov 10 2020). This text is used for Contemporary Art I and II. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING

CONTEMPORARY DRAWING

This course invites students to push the boundaries of traditional drawing and explore the diverse approaches and techniques of contemporary drawing. The work of contemporary artists will be discussed as a way to inform creative processes and challenge conventional notions of drawing. Through weekly slide presentations, discussions, and projects, students will develop a deeper understanding of conceptual approaches in drawing and gain the skills to create meaningful and thought-provoking artworks. The course will include sessions in collage, deconstructing photographs, and experimenting with other unconventional drawing techniques. With a focus on concept and ideas, this course will encourage you to think critically and experiment boldly. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: BEYOND REALISM

While navigating through an abundance of unverified content and digitally-constructed realities on a daily basis, we continuously have to decipher what is real and what is fake. As the definition of 'real' itself becomes vague, this drawing course embraces this uncertainty and attempts to redefine what realist drawing can be. Students will examine precedent works of realism and learn techniques of representational drawing before experimenting with new methods of depicting reality. Through in-class exercises and assignments, students will explore different ways of capturing reality by illustrating physical forms, movement, time, and narratives. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING FOR THE ABSOLUTE BEGINNER

Do you want to learn to draw but don't know how to get started? This is an ideal course for people with little or no experience in drawing. The course involves drawing from direct observation with an emphasis on line quality, value, shading, negative space and perspective. The skills necessary to make a good drawing are developed through basic materials such as pencils and charcoal. Source material will include still life arrangements, working from nature, a live model and photographs. This course will also include a couple of field trips so that the students can experience drawing on location. By the end of twelve weeks you will have the confidence to sit down in front of any subject and start to draw. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: HISTORY AND PRACTICE

This hands-on online drawing course explores the evolution of drawing from the Renaissance to the contemporary era, covering both historical and contemporary practices. Through a series of image presentations, the instructor will highlight major points in drawing history and present related projects. Students will work with a range of drawing materials and a variety of subjects that cover both representation and abstraction. The course concludes with a final project where students create drawings based on a selected historical period or style, integrating learned techniques and fostering personal expression. Suitable for all levels.

DRAWING: INTRODUCTION I

This course provides students with an introduction to the basic materials and techniques of drawing. Emphasis is on elements such as line, shape, value, space, proportion, perspective and composition. In addition, students are encouraged to explore a range of materials and develop personal expression in their drawing. Subject matter includes still life, the figure, landscape, architectural space and student-supplied source material. *Suitable for all levels*.

DRAWING PEOPLE

Drawing People is a course that combines skill and imagination with a sense of play. Students will learn to make convincing drawings of people that grasp the individual's personality. The course will include introductory skills needed for drawing the human figure such as proportion and basic human anatomy. Students will see have these tools can help make drawings of figures with convincing poses that look three-dimensional. Students will learn realistic, stylized and character-driven approaches to drawing people with an emphasis on attitude, body language and performing. Projects will be done with a variety of drawing materials with a mixed-media approach being encouraged. Resource material include photo-references provided by the instructor and students.

DRAWING: THEMATIC APPROACHES

This drawing course focuses on some of the current themes in contemporary drawing such as: mark making, mapping, science, nature, architecture, ornament, narrative and nostalgia. A mixed media approach will be encouraged to implement imaginative explorations in image making. Students use basic drawing materials such as pencil, charcoal, ink and watercolours, as well as a range of drawing surfaces including new and found papers. This course provides an ideal way to explore a range of subject matter while trying out different drawing materials. *Previous drawing experience recommended.*

MIXED MEDIA

KNITTING & FELTING: TIME AND PLACE

Students will learn basic knitting and felting techniques in this craft-focused course. These skills will be expanded to include working with repurposed wool and pre-made woolen items. The themes of time and place-making will be discussed along with presentations of contemporary artwork. Students will have opportunities to learn and develop skills in sculpture, performance and site-specific installation. Previous experience with the craft skills and art mediums are not necessary; students will be supported and challenged at their skill level. Suitable for all levels.

PAINTING

THE PAINTER'S PROCESS

This is course for anyone who wonders what to paint or how to sort out their painting ideas. Class assignments begin with a visual presentation of paintings (historical and contemporary) with a focus on a fundamental aspect of painting that is shared by numerous painters. These can include formal qualities such as value or consideration of process like sketching in paint. Through these painting projects students learn effective strategies and creative problem solving for painters. The course will explore the rich variety of painting processes that can inspire and help students move forward in their painting practice. Class projects will emphasize the development of personal imagery and subject matter. Students can work in acrylic or oil. *Previous painting experience recommended.*

PAINTING: INTRODUCTION I

Students will develop an understanding of the basic elements of painting such as shape, space and composition as well as how to develop a full colour palette in this introductory level course. There is also a focus on the material qualities of paint including mixing and application to surfaces. Students are encouraged to develop their own language and approach to painting as they learn basic techniques. Classes include hands-on demonstrations, the use of still life, found imagery, live models and photographs. Students can work in acrylics or oils. Suitable for all levels.

PAINTING: THE LURE OF THE LOCAL

This painting course is inspired by writer and art critic Lucy Lippard's book of the same title. The focus will be on understanding our relationship to place as a source for subject matter. Projects include ideas around memory, land use, cities and suburbs, perception of nature, how we produce the landscape and how the landscape affects our lives. This course provides a way for students to make use of their personal experience of place as an integral part of their artmaking practice. Students can work in a painting medium of their choice (acrylic, oil, watercolour or gouache). *Previous painting experience recommended*.

PAINTING TODAY I

Painting Today I offers a thematic approach to the hands-on study of painting. The course begins with an overview of the state of contemporary painting and includes the following approaches to painting: neo-expressionism, the photographic subject, the figure, the role of space, and both pure and ambiguous approaches to abstraction. Class exercises and projects will be supplemented with visual presentations on historical and contemporary artists working within the specified themes. *Previous painting experience recommended.*

PAINTING: UNDERSTANDING ABSTRACTION I

This hands-on painting course will follow the trajectory of abstract painting from its early beginnings in the late 19th century to the end of the 20th century. Th Each week students will learn about several artists, and then develop their own painting based on one of the artists shown. Course will include weekly critiques, slide presentations on the history of abstraction as well as hands-on exercises to be done in class. You will learn that abstraction is much more complex and interesting than you ever could imagine. Recommended Textbook: Moszynska, Anna Abstract Art Thames & Hudson, 2020 Edition. PAINTING WITH GOUACHE: PLANTS AND FLOWERS

Gouache (pronounced 'gwash') is an opaque, highly pigmented water-based medium that dries to a smooth velvety finish. In this course, you will learn many techniques and approaches to painting with gouache using plants and flowers as the subject. Each week will consist of a particular focus including botanical studies, tropical plants, Renaissance tapestries, Persian floral patterns and floral landscapes. Examples of historical and contemporary artists who use plants and flowers in their work will be discussed in relation to each week's project. The course will include colour theory, making dynamic compositions as well developing endless ideas for future gouache projects. *Suitable for all levels*.

PHOTOGRAPHY

MAKING A GREAT PHOTOGRAPH

Photography is what you make of it and your camera is the tool used to create your vision. Used properly, it is capable of creating amazing photographs. This requires you to understand how a camera works, and so you must learn its most important settings. Although a manual camera is not required for the course, the course will briefly cover basic manual operations of the camera (ISO, Shutter Speed and Aperture). We will also touch on digital darkroom solutions including Adobe Bridge, Camera Raw and Adobe Photoshop. Overall, the course will help you understand the basics of composition, light and getting your camera to catch what your eye sees to produce better images. . Suitable for all levels.

NATURE DRAWING ON MYLAR October 5 In-person

This workshop takes inspiration from botanical subject matter as you discover the excitement of drawing on Mylar. Artists love this archival polyester film because its surface quality makes it suitable for a range of drawing media including graphite, charcoal and watercolour. Its surface is satiny smooth and semi-transparent so it can be used over a photographic reference or you can superimpose two or more sheets to create interesting effects. You will be introduced you to a variety of mark-making techniques and processes that are unique to Mylar in this nature-focussed workshop.

EMBROIDERY ON PHOTOGRAPHS October 5 Online

This unique workshop will reveal ways to add dimensions and colours to your family photos or found vintage photos using a range of embroidery stitches. Embroidery patterns can embellish items in the photographs such as clothing or objects; or they can be used to add new elements, or even create new personalities of the figures in the photo. You will learn basic embroidery stitches and how to apply them to the photographs.

TONAL VALUES FOR PAINTERS October 19 Online

The tonal values of colour are not always easy to perceive, but they are key to creating paintings with a comprehensive sense of light. This workshop offers exercises to help gain a more fundamental understanding of tonal values as well as strategies for using light and dark to gain more impact. The workshop will include a short visual presentation on the way tonal values help to communicate the 'mood' of any given painting. Following the presentation, students will be given a series of tonal exercises, and work towards a small painted study to make use of what is demonstrated in the workshop.

WATERCOLOUR SKIES October 19 In-person

Artists have been intrigued by skies and clouds for centuries and in this workshop, we will carry on the tradition of using the sky as a subject for painting. The work of several artists including J.M.W. Turner and John Constable will be examined as a source of inspiration. You will learn to create the appearance of various cloud types -cumulus, cirrus, and stratus using wet-on-wet and wet-on-dry watercolour techniques. You will create a series of watercolour skyscapes that range from sunny, bright skies to dark and foreboding ones.



DRAWING: ABSTRACT ARCHITECTURE October 26 Online

This workshop will use the theme of architecture as a source for drawings with conté crayon. In the first exercise students will use the architectural structure of a room and then develop it into an abstract composition. The second exercise involves creating an abstract cityscape with rectangular shapes that evolve into building-like structures. You will learn why black conté crayon is an excellent and easy-to-use drawing material, especially because of its ability to create velvety rich black tones.

COLLAGE: ABSTRACT DESIGN November 2 In-person

The collage process is an ideal way to learn about abstract design because all elements within the work can be arranged and rearranged until a satisfying composition is achieved. Exploration and experimentation are key to enjoying the collage process. Strong abstract designs can be developed by using everyday found materials such as coloured paper, magazines, discarded books and glue sticks. This workshop focuses on how to find abstraction within nature, exploring colour relationships, as well as using value, shape, and contrast to create dynamic compositions. These collages may be considered finished works or as inspiration for larger painting or mixed media projects.

DRAWING ROCKS AND CLIFFS November 2 Online


There is intense pleasure in the intimacy of drawing a thing that you can hold in your hand -in this case 'rocks.' You will learn to observe the minute details found in rocks and draw them using a range of graphite pencils. The focus will be on textures, creating three-dimensional forms and shadows. The skills learned from drawing rocks will be applied to cliffs, and you will explore drawing cliffs from a photo reference (to be provided in advance). If you love looking at rocks or rocky cliffs, then you will love this workshop.

The combination of pen, ink and watercolour is a favourite of illustrators, urban sketchers, and other artists. These media can work together to result in loose, layered, and experimental effects. The addition of ink adds drama to subtle watercolour, and adding splashes of watercolour to an ink-only image results in a lively and engaging surface. Throughout this workshop, students will work on several images, including urban and natural subject matter.

This workshop promises to ignite your creativity and expand your understanding of pattern creation in both traditional and contemporary contexts. Techniques and concepts learned can be applied to a range of drawing, painting or mixed-media projects. Exercises are accompanied by hands-on demonstrations and image presentations. Projects will involve using a range of drawing materials including graphite pencils, pens, coloured pencils and oil pastels.

You will experiment with and explore the different types of charcoal, papers and eraser. Using photographs as a source of imagery, we will capture a sense of place and learn to translate our photos into evocative charcoal drawings.

Linocut is a great way to try a very basic method of printmaking. In this workshop you will discover the necessary techniques to do one of the boldest forms of relief printing. You will learn how to print onto fabric using a lino-cutting tool and Lino Speedy Cut Plate to design your own printed textiles using inspiration from nature around us. The resulting projects could be used for pillows, bags, or as artworks.

DRAWING BIRDS AND MAMMALS December 7 In-person

This workshop focuses on the beautiful birds and animals that live on Vancouver Island. You will work from a range of photographic references to capture four local creatures, including the noble bald eagle and the busy marmot. Nature sketch artist, Val Lawton, will guide you through the sketching process, starting with the subject's basic shapes, identifying the creature's form, and then moving on to rendering the appearance of furry, feathery, or scaly textures. We will begin with using a range of graphite pencils and then move on to colourful pencil crayons.
